Workshop Programmes

All face-to face workshops will be held at your school for groups of 25 students and timings will follow your normal school day. However, we are flexible with regard to times so please let us know your requirements.

Please find details below of the workshop programmes available.

GCSE English Language (Years 10 – 11, or Year 9 preparation)

GCSE English Language workshops are designed as core subject booster sessions for your students. We have provided some example topics below; however, programmes are designed in partnership with you, covering subject topics most suitable for your students.

GCSE English: reading with a language focus

Explicit and implicit language; subject terminology; exploring how writers achieve effects and influence readers; and answering questions about language.

GCSE English: creative and imaginative writing

Generating ideas, planning and structure; writing engaging narratives; writing amazing descriptions and technical skills.

GCSE English: writing for purpose (non-fiction) Making a start; developing a point of view; the importance of language; writing convincing texts and technical skills.

GCSE English: spoken language

A complete guide to presentation skills from writing and structuring a formal presentation through to delivery (including confidence, body language and use of voice).

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GCSE Maths (Years 10 - 11, or Year 9 preparation)

GCSE Maths workshops are designed as core subject booster sessions for your students. We have provided some example topics below; however programmes are designed in partnership with you covering topics most useful for your students.

GCSE Maths (Foundation)

Number workshop

Factors and multiples; squares, cubes and roots; calculations (BIDMAS); decimals and index notation.

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Angles workshop

Properties of shapes; angles in triangles; angles in parallel lines; exterior and interior angles and geometrical problem-solving.

Fractions and percentages workshop

Rounding; place value; operations with fractions and percentages; finding a fraction of a quantity / measurement and problem-solving with fractions and percentages.

GCSE Maths (Higher)

Number workshop

Calculating with powers; zero, negative and fractional indices; powers of 10 and standard form; upper and lower bounds; surds and problem-solving.

Ratio and percentages workshop

Fractions, decimals and percentages; ratio and proportion; percentage change and reverse percentages; growth and decay; and problem-solving.

Circle Theorems workshop

Radii and cords; tangents; angle and circles; circle theorems; vectors and problem-solving.

Developing your study skills (Years 9 - 12)

This workshop will provide your students with a complete study skills toolkit covering time management; your memory and how it works; working independently and collaboratively and target setting. Students will be given a variety of techniques and strategies that they can apply to any subject.

From getting involved in classroom discussion and debate to delivering a formal presentation, this workshop will focus on practical skills to enable your students to communicate confidently and effectively.






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Sixth Form induction (Year 11)

We want your students to feel confident and motivated as they enter sixth form, ready to meet the different demands of Year 12 and knowing exactly what to expect. By equipping your students with an extensive toolkit of expert study skills, the workshop will encourage independent learning, review and self-evaluation – the key components for Sixth Form success.

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Most appropriate for delivery in the summer term, the programme includes an exploration of the learning environment and introduction to the psychology of learning; activities to raise self-awareness as a learner and strategies for managing time. Students will also utilise independent and collaborative learning skills (Cornell note-taking, condensing, setting targets and objectives, review and reflection). The programme will conclude with a summary of the factors for success in post-16 education and students will set short, medium and long-term targets for themselves.
